The Victorian Era

The period of time between 1837 to 1901 when Queen Victoria **reigned** over Britain. During her 63 year **reign**, there was a huge contrast between how the rich and poor Victorians lived. Queen Victoria led the expansion of the British empire and saw major changes to all aspects of Britain due to exciting discoveries and **inventions**.

Queen Victoria was born on 24th May 1819 (more than 200 years ago).

Victoria became Queen in 1837 when she was only 18 years old.

When Queen Victoria was 21 years old she married her cousin Albert. Victoria and Albert had 9 children! They had four sons and five daughters.

She ruled over a huge empire as well as Britain. Her empire included New Zealand, South Africa, Canada and India.

Sadly, Albert died in 1861 when he was 42 years old. After her husband, Albert, died she wore black clothes for the rest of her life.

Queen Victoria died in 1901 when she was 81 years old.
