Brownies

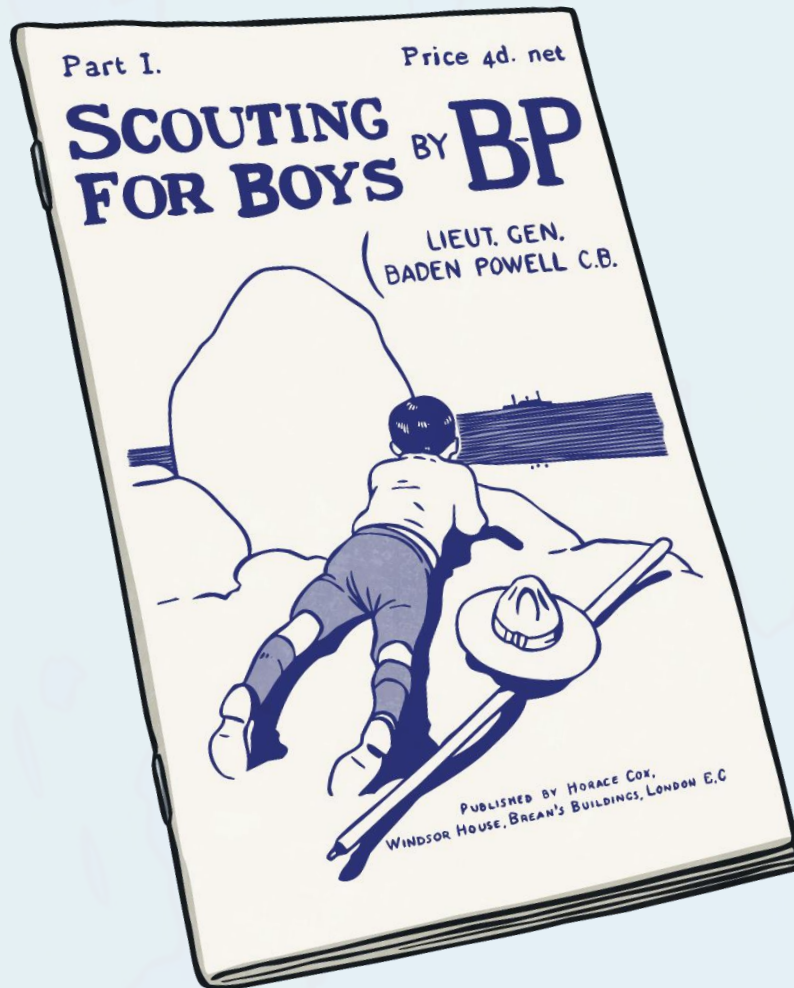

How Did the Girl Guides Start?

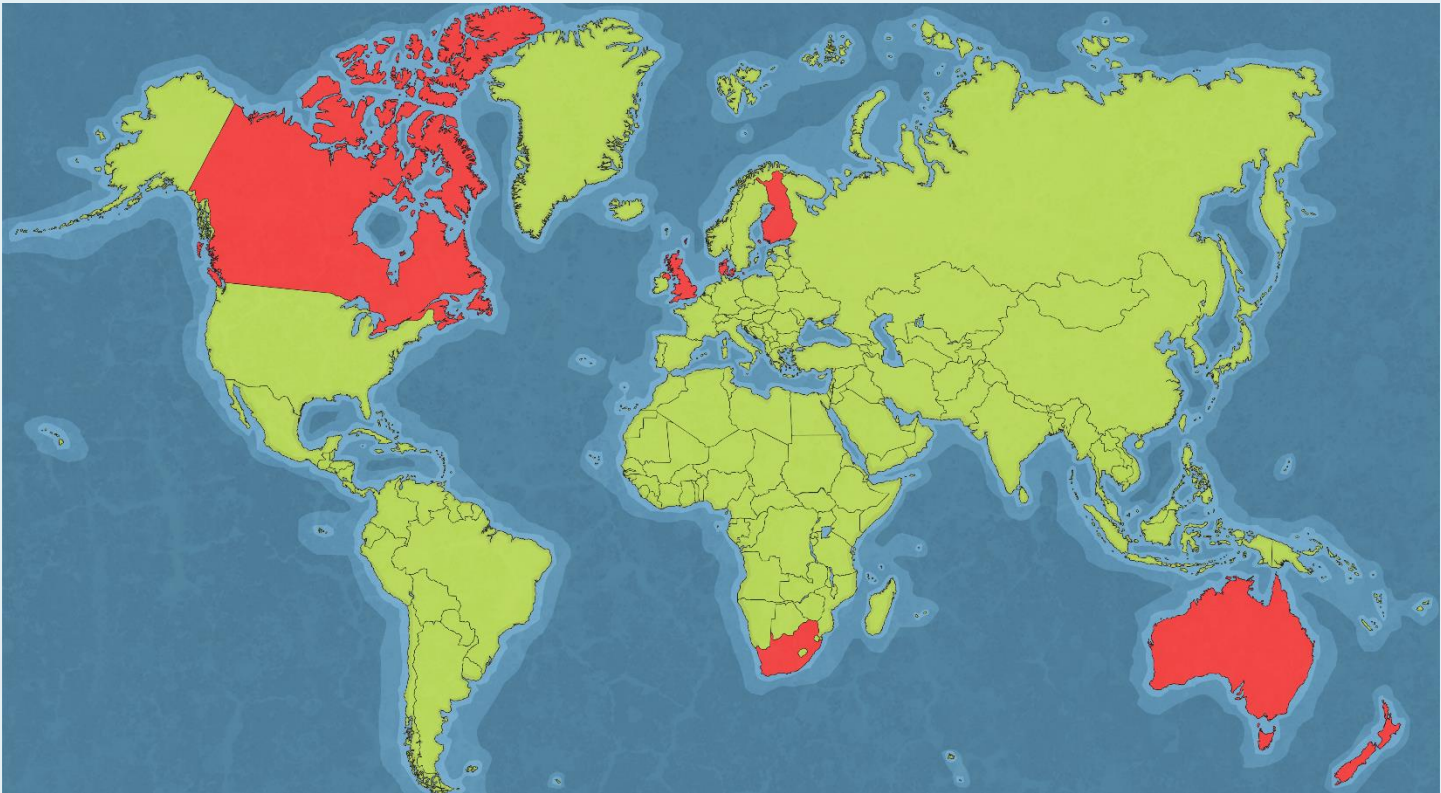


In 1908, a man named Lord Robert Baden-Powell wrote a book called 'Scouting for Boys'. This became the inspiration for the Scouts Movement, which was just for boys.

In 1909, a group of girls went to a Scout rally and said they were Girl Scouts. This made Lord Baden-Powell decide that there should be a girls' equivalent to the Scouts.

How Did the Girl Guides Start?

Today there were Girl Guides in 15 countries.
Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Iceland, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg, and the United States.



World Thinking Day

World Thinking Day is on 22nd February each year. It is a time when Girl Guides and Girl Scouts join together to think of each other and people all around the world.

Each year has a different theme. These themes have included:

This year's theme is **Our World, Our Equal Future**. This year, Girl Guides and Girl Scouts will explore how climate change affects the lives of women all around the world.

They will think about the link between climate change and gender equality, and how we can help the planet and allow us to have a sustainable future.

How Did World Thinking Day Start?

In 1926, people from the Girl Guides and Girl Scouts across the world met in the United States.

They chose 22nd February because it was not only the birthday of Lord Baden-Powell, but also that of his wife, Lady Baden-Powell.
